### **COMMENTS**

This was a partial inspection by Leigh Simmons of the Colorado Divsion for Reclamation, Mining and Safety (the Division). No representative of New Elk Coal Company (NECC) was present. The weather was clear and dry, although the first 3 weeks of August had been unusually wet.

Most of the Golden Eagle mine has previously received final bond release; the site that continues to operate under a DRMS permit is limited to a reclaimed ventilation shaft and pad, and reclaimed access roads.

#### HYDROLOGIC BALANCE - Rule 4.05

Drainage Control 4.05.1, 4.05.2, 4.05.3; Siltation Structures 4.05.5, 4.05.6; Discharge Structures 4.05.7, 4.05.10; Diversions 4.05.4; Effluent Limits 4.05.2; Ground Water Monitoring 4.05.13; Surface Water Monitoring 4.05.13; Drainage – Acid and Toxic Materials 4.05.8; Impoundments 4.05.6, 4.05.9; Stream Buffer Zones 4.05.18:

The site was well drained, with no muddy patches. The erosion noted previously in the natural drainage at the north-eastern edge of the site had not yet been repaired. The rills and a small gully within the Golden Eagle disturbed area boundary markers should be repaired, and flow control structures, such as straw wattles, should be installed to prevent further damage.

#### GENERAL MINE PLAN COMPLIANCE:

The mine was in compliance with the permit. Technical Revision 57 is still in progress; NECC are in the process of responding to some adequacy issues.

The valves shown in photo 2 of the April 29th inspection report, photo 2 of the July 23rd inspection report, and again below, are associated with gas pipelines. The valves are located outside of the disturbance boundary, but are within the permit boundary. Rule 2.10.3(e) requires that any pipelines within the permit boundary be displayed on a map. NECC should verify the location of the pipeline and ensure that it is included on a map to be submitted with TR57.

NECC intend to carry out vegetation sampling this summer in order to prepare for a future bond release application - it is important to note that TR57 may be used to revise the sampling plan to ensure statistical validity. The currently approved sampling plan will likely be difficult to implement over such a small site.

### REVEGETATION - Rule 4.15:

Vegetative Cover; Timing:

Vegetative cover and diversity appeared very good. Noxious weeds were not observed.

#### SIGNS AND MARKERS – Rule 4.02:

The mine ID sign was in compliance, although the temporary alterations made with paper and clear tape are deteriorating with exposure to the weather. A permanent sign should be put in place soon.
