AB 80 – Well Drillers • AB253 – Interbasin Transfer/Adjudication AB265 – Domestic Well Drawdown AB331 – Water Speculation AB349 – Appropriation to DWF AB434 – Omnibus Bill SB35 – Interbasin transfer fee bil SB62 – Modifies change application process SB216 – Water Planning to DWR SB320 – DWR legislative oversight committee

### Water Right Applications

#### **Receiving 1200+ applications per year**

- Increasingly complex
- Applicants becoming `innovative'
- More litigious
- 80% are changes of existing rights
  - Changes of small amounts (<.5 acre-foot)</li>
- Titles section dealing with >1000 reports of conveyances and >10,000 deeds
  - Privatization?
