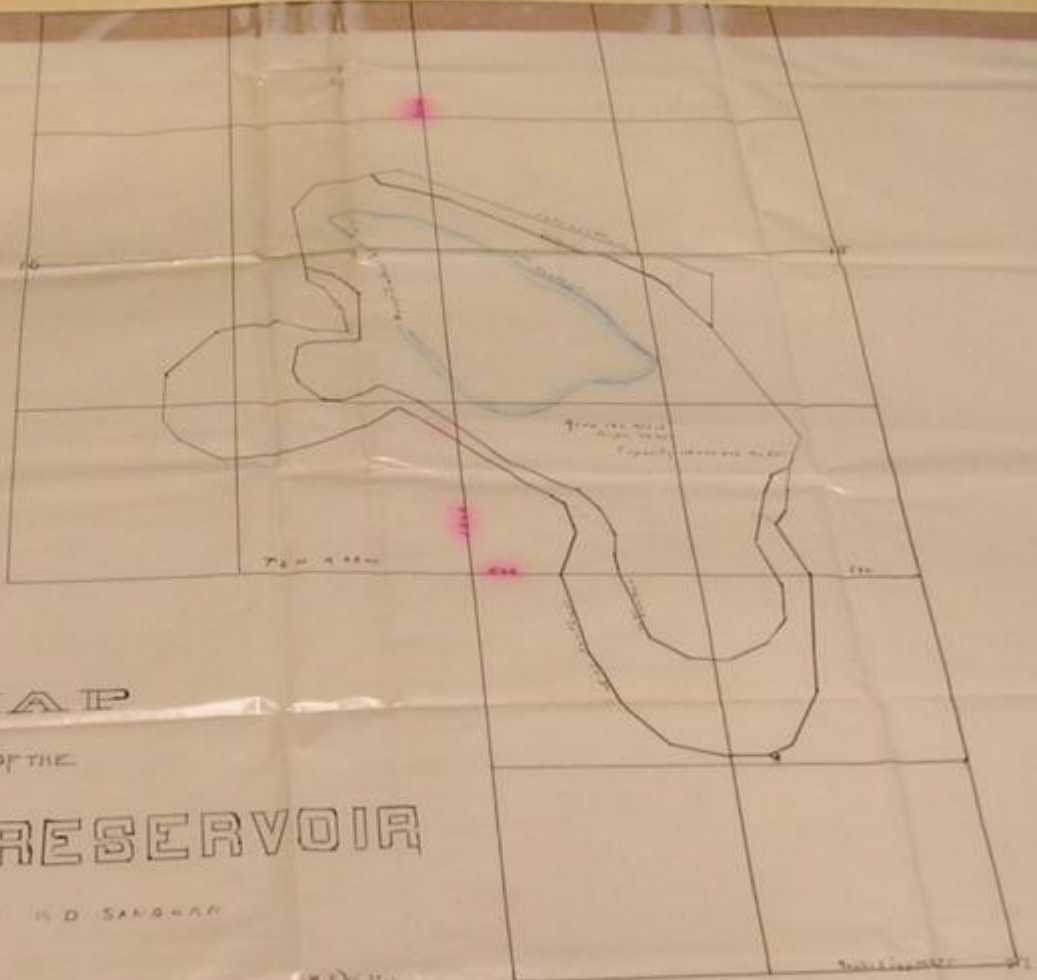

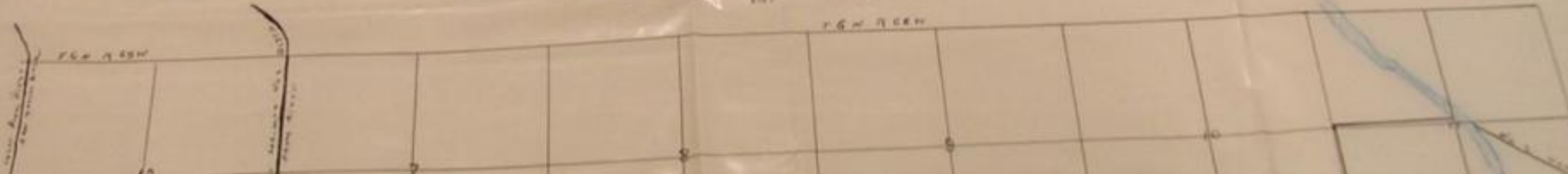


MAP

for Secretary and J. S. Dunbar for Treasurer.
C. E. Miller, A. R. Coffey, and J. S. Dunbar
were duly elected.

Then followed the
election of Supt.

A. R. Coffey & C. H. Welch
were nominated. C. H. Welch being elected.
C. H. Welch, C. E. Miller & A. R. Coffey were
chosen trustees for the ensuing year.
A report of the Treasurer and then
handed in, showing a balance of \$72.25
in his hands. The same was approved
of. A report of the Supt was then read
and discussed, and a settlement made
with all parties.

The expense of running
the ditch for the last year was \$70.00
the trustees were then instructed to
look over the line of ditch on the 11th and
ascertain what work was necessary to be done
and make a report at the next meeting.
Upon motion, the meeting then adjourned
to March 11th 1887. 1 o'clock P.M.

Abstract:	The Section No. 3 Ditch Company was incorporated in March 1870 in Weld County. The company constructed its ditch to divert water from the South Platte River for agriculture, milling and dairying purposes. In 1910, it was reincorporated as the Godfrey Ditch Company. The collection contains the minute books of both companies, which span the years 1870 to 1986. Also included are account ledgers and stock registers, as well as some legal documents and historical information.

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Series 1: Bound volumes, 1870-1996 and undated (0.6 linear feet)

This series of bound volumes is divided into two categories: minutes and finances. The former consists of the minute books of the Section No. 3 Ditch Company and the Godfrey Ditch Company from 1870 through 1986. In these are recorded the business of the organization, from officer elections to ditch maintenance issues. One of the volumes also contains stock register entries as well as the certificate of incorporation and bylaws. The second category of finances encompasses the ledger books of the organizations, documenting stock transactions. Materials are arranged chronologically in each category.
