Water Court/DE Consultation Water right application submitted to water court - what happens next? The water court Referee is responsible for investigating applications to determine if statements in applications are true.

Referee consults with Division Engineer.

- Referee consults with DE
 - Section 37-92-302(4) of Colorado Revised Statutes
 - DE files report concerning administration and potential for injury.
- DWR may become party to the case.
 Section 37-92-302(1)(b)

- Change of Water Rights What?
- A change in the type, place, or time of use, a change in the point of diversion, a change in the place of storage, ... Definition in Section 37-92-103(5)
- Only the water courts can adjudicate changes of water rights.

Water Court/DE Consultation Change of Water Right - What? Change from crop irrigation to other uses such as municipal, are common, but change can potentially be from any

use/to any use.



Change of Water Rights Colorado Supreme Court has indicated there are two basic principles concerning a change of water right: I. No injury to other water rights. 2. Extent of beneficial use of the original appropriation limits amount that can be changed (i.e. -no expansion of use).



COLORADO Division of Water Resources

- Change of Water Rights
 - Extent of beneficial use of the original appropriation = historical consumptive use (HCU).
 - For change of crop irrigation rights, HCU limitations may include season of use, and average and maximum volumetric limits for monthly and annual periods.

Change of Water Rights Statutory guidance section 37-92-305(3)(d): Quantification of HCU must be based on an analysis of the actual historical use of the water right for its decreed purposes during a representative period that includes wet, dry, and average years.



COLORADO Division of Water Resources

Change of Water Rights "Actual historical use" = HCU For an irrigation water right, the HCU must be estimated using a variety of factors/data including, diversion records, weather records, acres irrigated, irrigation efficiency, crop type, and crop evapotranspiration rate.

- Change of Water Rights
 Why?
- Water Court process to change a water right can be a lengthy, expensive processes, so why undertake this process?
- Priority, Priority, Priority!



COLORADO Division of Water Resources

Why does priority matter? Colorado administers water rights according to the prior appropriation doctrine, so senior water rights are entitled to divert before junior rights. More senior right = more valuable right



COLORADO Division of Water Resources



- DE's consultation with Referee to evaluate assumptions used in HCU analysis.
 - Terms/conditions to prevent injury.
 Section 37-92-305(3)(e) HCU for new change of water right shall not be reconsidered or requantified if the right was previously changed by water court.



COLORADO Division of Water Resources

- Another situation-Augmentation
 - plans
- DE's consultation to evaluate assumptions used to estimate water use and the amount of required replacement water. Is injury prevented?
 - ET estimates may include pond evaporation, irrigation in subdivisions, & wetlands.

Substitute Water Supply Plans and other Administrative Approvals

Substitute Water Supply Plans SWSP - Statutes provide for temporary administrative approval of a plan for augmentation or change of water right. Many types, including: • 37-92-308(4) - pending court application • 37-92-308(5) - no court application; operation not to exceed 5 years



COLORADO Division of Water Resources

Substitute Water Supply Plans

- Other administrative approvals that can include a change of water right:
 37-92-309 Interruptible Water Supply Agreements
 37-83-105 Temporary loan for CWCB
 - instream flows
 - 37-90-107.5 Replacement plan in Designated Basins



COLORADO Division of Water Resources

Substitute Water Supply Plans

State Engineer given statutory authority to approve SWSP (or other administrative action) provided the operation and administration of the SWSP will prevent injury to other water rights and not impair compliance with interstate compacts.



COLORADO Division of Water Resources



Substitute Water Supply Plans SWSP for a change of water right will rely on same principles as a change in water court and will seek to prevent injury by limiting use of a changed water right to the HCU. For change of water right by SWSP, the HCU must be determined prior to action by water court.

Substitute Water Supply Plans

SWSP for new water use plan must evaluate assumptions used to estimate water use and the amount of required replacement water. Injury prevented?
ET estimates may include pond evaporation, irrigation in subdivisions, & wetlands.
