This project's scope is to automate sixteen headgates of the Bear River to improve water delivery, both natural and purchased and river administration. With its partner (UYWCD), CAA seeks to phase in automation through three funding cycles. This request aims to contract with the Bureau of Reclamation (BOR) Automation Group out of the Provo office to automate five headgates and install a communication base station for radio transmission. CAA would work with the Automation group to automate the five headgates between Summer/Fall 2026.

Water Project Justification

The goal of this project is to automate sixteen headgates on the Bear River, enhancing water delivery through natural, purchased, and river management efforts. This scope supports the vision of robust agriculture in the Colorado Water Plan. Adding automation to the Bear River (through a phased approach, utilizing both federal and state funds) will help meet future water needs for agricultural producers and promote efficient water use through conveyance and on-farm improvements.

This application is for phase 2 of the project (federal, state, and local grants funded phase 1), which will add automation to the next five priority headgates on the Bear River. These installations enable more responsive adjustments to changes in river flows and reduce instances of available flow bypassing headgates that move in and out of priority based on stream flow. Automation in systems like the Bear River has demonstrated increased water efficiency and will also decrease the time commitment for ditch owners and DWR staff, as well as reduce water conflicts.

This project scope also supports three Yampa-White-Green Basin Implementation Plan goals:

Restore, maintain, and modernize water storage and distribution infrastructure.

Improve agricultural water supplies.

Protect and encourage agricultural use of water in the YWG basin,

This project scope also supports the Yampa Integrated Water Management Plan's recommendation to obtain funding for implementing multi-benefit diversion structure upgrades.
