Northern Water's Requested Relief

- The CWCB should defer its decision to allow continued negotiation and development of a revised proposal. It can do so by either:
 - 1. Securing the River District's agreement to an extension of the statutory 120-day period; or
 - 2. Denial of the present proposal
- If the CWCB accepts the acquisition, the ISF Agreement must be revised



A Collaborative Alternative That Preserves CWCB Authority

- 1 CWCB will exercise Shoshone Water Rights for ISF use to the maximum extent under the terms of the water court change decree, subject to the following:
- (2) Parties may submit requests for call reductions in exceptional circumstances
- 3 CWCB will convene a diverse advisory group to consider the request, its effects, and terms and conditions to apply if implemented
- (4) CWCB makes final determination whether to grant the request and reduce call
- 5 Reduction only to the minimum extent necessary to address the reasons for the request
- 6 CWCB or River District may make contractual or other arrangements to address need for or effects of reduction




Front Range Parties - Roadmap



Colorado River Mainstem Operations








Green Mountain Reservoir

CBT Replacement Pool - 52,000 acre-ft

Operates to replace out-of-priority CBT Collection System diversions


Power Pool ("West Slope Pool") – 100,000 acre-ft

- Historic Users Pool (66,000 af)
 - Replacement of Irrigation & Domestic use perfected prior to October 15, 1977
 - Grand Valley Supplemental Direct Delivery
- Silt Pool (5,000 af) Silt Project/Managed by Silt Water Conservancy District (not in Operating Policy)
- Contract Pool (~20,000 af) Release schedules based on needs of contracts
