Draft DWR memo

Draft DWR memo:

1. Understanding of Water Exchange Projects

Exchanges:

- Limited to operations that can be administratively approved by DWR per 37-83-104 and 37-80-120
- Surface water
- Deliver water directly into the public stream
- Take water directly from the public stream higher up



Exchange Example

Two distinct water rights:



A <u>surface diversion</u> out-of-priority priority date 6-1-1935

The water right for the <u>exchange</u> depletes the stream reach by 10 cfs; an exchange can be:

- decreed with a priority date, or
- administratively approved (without a decreed priority date) if the diminished flow does not impact other water rights.

Senior calling right (1870) 70 cfs



Draft DWR memo: 1. Understanding of Water Exchange Projects

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Water Exchange Projects in a plan for augmentation:

Upstream diversion / depletion and downstream replacement that does not qualify as an exchange under the statute.



Draft DWR memo:

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Water Exchange Projects in a plan for augmentation:

- > Examples:
 - depletions are from lagged well depletions or an off-stream pond
 - downstream
 replacement is from
 recharge accretions
- Not directly "delivered" into the stream, or not directly "take(n)" from the stream

Exchange vs. Water Exchange Project Examples

Water Exchange Project

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Water Exchange Project Example 1

- Water is taken from the aquifer by a well. Delayed depletions occur at the stream.
- Two water rights:
- the well has a groundwater right*, but diverts out-of-priority in an augmentation plan
- the Water Exchange Project depletes streamflow in a reach with a priority date in an augmentation plan

*the groundwater right need not be decreed, if not, it is junior to all other rights





Water Exchange Project Example 2

Replacement water is not "delivered to the stream", it is delivered to a recharge pond

Two water rights:

- the surface diversion is out-of-priority
- the Water Exchange Project depletes streamflow in a reach with a priority date in an augmentation plan

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Draft DWR memo: 1. Understanding of Water Exchange Projects

Water Exchange Project Terminology:

- Statutory term in 37-92-103(9) and 37-92-305(3)(a) = <u>Water Exchange Project</u>
- May include multiple different water rights claiming exchange potential within a plan for augmentation. For tabulation purposes, DWR suggests the term <u>Exchange Project Right</u> for each claim of exchange potential that would not qualify as an Exchange.



Draft DWR memo: 2. DWR's plans in near-term water court cases

Through 2021

- communicate and inform about the concept of Water Exchange Projects but do not initiate litigation
- gather feedback and suggestions



Draft DWR memo: 2. DWR's plans in near-term water court cases (planned through 2021)

- a. Application includes a plan for augmentation
- Comment when a claim of exchange potential should be termed a Water Exchange Project within the plan for augmentation
 - Do not litigate this position through 2021



Draft DWR memo:

2. DWR's plans in near-term water court cases (planned through 2021)

b. Application does not include a plan for augmentation

- Comment that the correct claim is a Water Exchange Project within a plan for augmentation
 - If the claim is similar to Tri-State (15CW3178) exchange to upstream well depletions - litigate the need for an augmentation plan, if necessary
 - If not similar to Tri-State, stick to "communicate and inform" role



Draft DWR memo: 3. DWR's plans in water court in 2022

- Continue to communicate and inform
- > Litigate if necessary to obtain appropriate decrees



Draft DWR memo: 4. Administration of Decrees

- > Continue to administer existing decrees
- Do not seek to change existing decrees to conform to the new understanding of Water Exchange Projects in applications for:
 - diligence
 - changes of water rights
 - amendment proceedings involving previous decrees



Draft DWR memo: 4. Administration of Decrees

Plans for augmentation with downstream replacement and no exchange or Water Exchange Project

- a. existing and 2021 cases continue to administer (assume decree includes a finding of no injury)
- b. 2022 and later cases -
 - i. suggest either there should be an Exchange Project Right (or exchange if it qualifies) with a priority date,
 - ii. or, the plan for augmentation must have a way to curtail or provide upstream replacement for the no injury claim to be appropriate.



Draft DWR memo: 4. Administration of Decrees

c. Existing decreed exchanges that do not qualify as a statutory exchange

- continue to administer according to the terms of the decree.
- d. Use of previously-decreed accretions for non-decreed uses
- according to procedures prescribed by law.
- any use for replacement of an upstream diversion/depletion if not already decreed should be pursuant to a Water Exchange Project.



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
